Dear AABB Members:

AABB's strength is derived from our members and the collaboration of this incredible community. Members like you – those working hard every day to advance the safety and efficacy of blood and biotherapies worldwide – are at the heart of this community. Thank you for your contributions to our Association and for advancing the blood and biotherapies field to improve the lives of patients throughout the world.

Understanding the financial pressures many of our members are facing, AABB is limiting our dues increase for 2024 to four percent (4%) for both individual and institutional members. For an individual member, this is an average increase of approximately \$5. For an institutional member, this represents an average increase of \$200 in annual dues.

We know that as operational costs continue to rise, staffing and other challenges remain top of mind. As our members work to address these challenges, AABB supports our community and champions the advancement of the field.

Throughout the past year, AABB has continued to add significant value to your membership with the goal of supporting your work and helping you address challenges.

A few examples include:

- Led the blood community through the adoption of Individual Donor Assessment (IDA). This included publishing the revised Donor History Questionnaire immediately after FDA's final approval and offering comprehensive free education and job aids to empower the community with the knowledge and training necessary to achieve successful implementation.
- Issued timely and comprehensive industry toolkits to help accredited facilities quickly adjust to regulatory changes including those focused on: Monkeypox, Cold-Stored Platelets, Regenerative Medicine Therapies, Tuberculosis and more.
- Developed the 2023 AABB International Guidelines on Red Blood Cell Transfusion, providing life-saving recommendations for the use of red blood cell transfusion in adults and children.
- Hosted dozens of new free educational programs to AABB members on critical and timely topics.
- Advocated for improved coverage and reimbursement policies and released an updated version of the US AABB Billing Guide for Blood Products and Related Services, available free for all AABB members.
- Developed the field's first credentialing program in advanced biotherapies to promote the expertise of our community: The AABB Certified Advanced Biotherapies Professional (CABP).
- Published AABB Commendable Practices as a key educational exchange to help AABB accredited facilities implement AABB Standards efficiently and effectively.
- And, coming soon: a fully updated global infectious diseases report.

Again, thank you for your continued membership with AABB. Together, we are stronger as we continue to lead the advancement of blood and biotherapies worldwide.
