INSTRUCTION GUIDE FOR THE AABB STATE POLICY BRIEFING TOOLKIT



The Association for the Advancement of Blood & Biotherapies (AABB) is an international, not-for-profit Association representing individuals and institutions in the fields of transfusion medicine and biotherapies. AABB supports members in their ongoing work to ensure a safe, available and resilient blood supply.

Why This PowerPoint Toolkit Was Created for Members

State-level policymaking has become increasingly important for issues affecting the blood community. In recent years, state policymakers have considered:

- Misinformation about blood safety and vaccination.
- Proposed bills that could reduce the eligible donor pool.
- Growing demands for emergency preparedness and prehospital transfusion programs.
- Increased scrutiny of the blood supply during disasters, pandemics and crises.

To help members respond to policymakers effectively, AABB developed this customizable PowerPoint deck as a “Briefing-in-a-Box.” The deck provides:

- Clear messaging on the blood supply and transfusion medicine.
- Policy recommendations aligned with AABB positions.
- Ready-to-use content that members can personalize and make state-specific for legislative briefings, policymaker meetings or educational events.

This resource is designed to encourage partnerships between policymakers and the blood community, and to help members speak with a unified, credible and compelling voice, while still allowing for strong local adaptation.

How to Use This PowerPoint Deck

This PowerPoint presentation is intended to support legislative briefings, one-on-one policymaker meetings or educational sessions. Below are instructions for preparing and tailoring the deck.

1. Review the Full Deck

Before customizing, take a moment to review all slides and speaker notes. This will help you understand:

- The flow of the presentation.



- The key messages in each advocacy area.
- Where state-specific or organization-specific information should be added.

2. **Customize the Slides for Your State or Organization**

The deck is fully editable. You are encouraged to tailor slides to best represent:

- Your state's blood supply challenges or data.
- Local policy issues or recent legislation.
- Patient or donor stories from your community.
- Your organization's services, coverage area or partners.

Slides with clear placeholders (e.g., "Insert state data here") are designed for quick customization.

3. **Use the Notes Sections for Suggested Talking Points**

AABB has included **suggested language** for each slide in the PowerPoint's *Notes* section. These notes:

- Provide sample phrasing to communicate each key message.
- Offer context behind the data or policy recommendations.
- Can be used as-is or adapted to your own speaking style.

Members should feel free to tailor any talking points to reflect:

- Their own experiences.
- Local circumstances.
- Current state policymaking environment.

4. **Add Your Contact Information and Call to Action**

The last slide you present (Slide 24), includes space to add your organizational contact information. Members should:

- Provide a direct point of contact.
- Invite policymakers to tour a local blood center or hospital blood bank.
- Follow up after the briefing with materials, such as a PDF copy of the PowerPoint deck, that policymakers can reference.

5. **Remove Slide 25 Before Using or Sharing the Deck**

- It contains instructions for members who may want to highlight additional state policies.
- It includes links to AABB positions, talking points and resources for bills being considered by some states, which address:
 - **Directed blood donations**
 - **Vaccinations and blood donation**

Tips for Using the Deck in Briefings

1. **Keep the presentation conversational.** The slides are designed to be visual and clear; the talking points come through your delivery.
2. **Tell a story.** Use at least one local patient or donor story to illustrate the impact of policy decisions.
3. **Focus on solutions.** Policymakers appreciate briefings that not only identify challenges but clearly state how they can help.
4. **Leave time for questions.** Many policymakers are unfamiliar with how the blood system operates, and therefore, this is an opportunity to educate.
